

Manufacturer's Certification Statement

MITER Brands™ provides this Manufacturer's Certification Statement so that you, the homeowner, can verify that certain doors manufactured by PGT Industries, LLC ("PGT"), a MITER Brand company, are eligible for the energy tax credits allowed by Section 25C of the Internal Revenue Code. The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 makes notable changes to the prior tax credit benefit which applies to qualifying exterior windows and doors installed between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2025 ("Qualified Energy Efficiency Improvements").

The tax credit for an individual is 30% of the amount paid or incurred for all Qualified Energy Efficiency Improvements made during the taxable year, for a maximum credit of \$1200 per year. See here for more information: <https://www.energystar.gov/about/federal-tax-credits>.

For exterior windows and skylights, the maximum credit allowed per year is \$600. For exterior doors, the maximum credit allowed per year is \$250 per door and \$500 total for all doors.

PGT units that qualify for the tax credit are the SGD5570 and SGD5470 that meet the Energy Star rating and installed within the Energy Star Climate Zone they are qualified under. **PGT's QMID Code is V3V8.**
